Entry requirements

Skills in applying and analysing occupational therapy process and methods to promote activity capacity.

Selection

The selection is based on 1-165 credits.

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Course Aim

In this course the student will deepen previous knowledge and experiences of models and concepts in occupational therapy with a focus on an evidence-based and health promotion working approach. Upon completion of the course, the student will, in the context of current laws and regulations, and with a scientific and ethical approach, meet the following objectives related to the course content:

- reason and discuss the complexity of human occupation based on concepts in occupational therapy in relation to prevention and promotion.
- analyse and evaluate theoretical approaches to occupational therapy and discuss how they support a therapeutic approach in client work.
- be familiar with the various quality assurance tools and be able to argue for the importance of quality improvement work in occupational therapy practices.
- search and critically review scientific articles in order to evaluate and argue for how research results can be utilised in practice based on an evidence perspective.
- analyse and evaluate his/her knowledge, skills and competence in relation to the requirements for a registered
 occupational therapist as well as reflect on the need for additional knowledge and continuing professional
 development.

Contents

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A deepening of occupational therapy theories and evidence-based working approaches is included in this course. In this course, methods for quality improvement work in occupational therapy are also included. Furthermore, the course contains critical reflection on the future professional role as an occupational therapist based on analysis and evaluation of his/her knowledge and the need to develop skills.

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

The course is in a distance learning format and is mainly web-based. Computer experience and access to an Internet connection equivalent to at least ADSL with headset and web camera are required for the studies. Parts of the course are located on campus where most seminars and examinations take place. In order to complete the course, the student should actively seek knowledge and solve problems using an inquiring and critically reflective approach. This means that the student should take responsibility by actively contributing to the achievement of course objectives through the planning of content and time. The contents of the course are delivered through literature studies, group exercises, lectures, oral and written presentations and seminars. Course requirements are attendance and an active participation in seminars as well as completed study assignments in accordance with the instructions in the study guide.



Syllabus

Examination
