#### **Course Aim**

On completion of the course, the student should, based on current laws and regulations and with a scientific and ethical approach, based on the contents of the course, be able to:

- identify and analyse the activity of people and activity patterns in relation to intersectionality with focus on age, equality, gender, cultural conditions, ethnicity and societal changes from a national and international perspective
- describe and explain how occupational therapy activities are structured from an organizational and administrative view
- act proactively and argue for occupational justice for different groups in society and give proposals for health promotion approaches
- from a creative and entrepreneurial approach identify challenges and develop an idea for a product or service that strengthens people's activity and participation possibilities



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#### Contents

The course gives both a refinement and broadening of previous knowledge and skills in how social structures and intersectional aspects influence the opportunity of activity and participation for people. The course includes knowledge on how occupational therapy can be organized in different work areas. The course will also provide the student with knowledge and skills in how to argue and act proactively concerning occupational therapy in new arenas embracing a creative and entrepreneurial approach.

- Disability policy
- Intersectionality from an activity and participation perspective

#### Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

The course is in a distance learning format and is mainly web-based. Computer experience and access to an Internet connection equivalent to at least ADSL with headset and web camera are required for the studies. Parts of the course are located on campus where most seminars and examinations take place. In order to complete the course, the student should actively seek knowledge and solve problems using an inquiring and critically reflective approach. This means that the student should take responsibility by actively contributing to the achievement of course objectives through the planning of content and time. The contents of the course are delivered through studying literature, group exercises, lectures, oral and written presentations and seminars. Course requirements are completed study assignments as well as compulsory attendance and an active participation in discussions at seminars.

#### **Examination**

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided. To pass the course, it is required that the student achieves the course objectives through the following examination sections:

- objectives one to three are examined through written assignments and seminars
- objective four are examined through written assignment and oral presentation
