Knowledge and understanding

- -the ability to discuss with insight, verbally and in writing, theoretical and methodology problems about musicianship and the cultivation of musical knowledge
- the ability, on the basis of one's own musical-artistic activity, to formulate and justify an independent attitude towards artistic research
- the ability to achieve realistic and thoroughly considered planning of one's future independent work

Evaluation ability and approach

- the ability to reflect critically on research and development work within the music sector
- the ability to critically examine and discuss other students' work on the course

- theory and debate about artistic research and the relationship between art and science
- central concepts and directions relating to cognition theory and scientific theory
- aesthetic theory with particular relevance to music
- current artistic research within the music sector
- research methods with relevance to artistic research
- planning of discussions about artistic research projects
