Entry requirements

In order to meet the general entry requirements for first cycle studies you must have successfully completed upper secondary education and documented skills in English language + Swedish upper secondary school course English 6.

Selection

The selection is based on final school grades or Swedish Scholastic Aptitude Test.

Course Aim

After the studies are completed the students will be able to:

- describe and critically evaluate important concepts within Knowledge Management
- analyse the use of IT in Knowledge Management
- analyse and evaluate an organization's use of Knowledge Management
- reflect on the importance of Knowledge in an organization
- critically examine their own use of Knowledge Management

Contents

The course starts by analysing and evaluation of how central concepts and relations are defined in current research. It continues with discussions about knowledge, how to gain knowledge and whether all knowledge can be made visible. Different processes, methods for knowledge management are presented and the students examine if and how these are used in a business / organization. The use of IT in Knowledge Management is also discussed. The last element of the course is for the students to critically examine their own use of Knowledge Management. Guest lectures from scholars in the field and working life presents different perspectives on Knowledge Management.

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

The course is conducted by distance tuition with no mandatory meetings. Communication is performed via the learning management system, e-mail, video conference and phone. The learning platform is used to post information, course materials and articles during the course. Students also participate in group discussions and submit both individual assignments and group work. The course includes a project work where the project group will map an organization's knowledge work and give recommendations and suggestions on how individuals and / or management could work to improve Knowledge Management.

Examination

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided. The course is examined as follows:

- Individual assignments, 3 hp, U G #
The examination consists of a number of written assignments and web-based discussions.
- Group assignments, 4.5 hp, U G #
The examination consists of a number of written and oral assignments that are submitted in groups.

Grading takes place according to grading scale U G #. All included examination parts must be completed for the final grade on the course.

Unauthorized aids during exams and assessments

If a student, by using unauthorized aids, tries to mislead during an exam or when a study performance is to be assessed, disciplinary measures may be taken. The term "unauthorized aids" refers to aids that the teacher has not previously specified as permissible aids and that may assist in solving the examination task. This means that all aids not specified as permissible are prohibited. The Swedish version has interpretative precedence in the event of a conflict.
