Entry requirements

In order to meet the general entry requirements for first cycle studies you must have successfully completed upper secondary education and documented skills in English language and completed the course Percussion 1 (D0201G) 7.5 credits with at least the grade Pass, or equivalent knowledge.

Selection

The selection is based on 1-165 credits.

Course Aim

Knowledge and understanding

Upon completion of the course, the student will demonstrate

- basic knowledge of their percussion instrument and its repertoire.

Competence and skills

Upon completion of the course, the student will demonstrate

- proficiency on their percussion instrument, technically and artistically, as well as the ability to perform genre-representative repertoire.

Judgement and approach

Upon completion of the course, the student will demonstrate

- reflection on one's own development and one's own learning.

Contents

The course includes playing music, exercises in playing techniques.

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

The course is carried out individually and/or in groups.

Examination

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided. Continuous examination is carried out orally and with a sounding presentation.

Final examination is carried out with a sounding presentation.

Unauthorized aids during exams and assessments

If a student, by using unauthorized aids, tries to mislead during an exam or when a study performance is to be assessed, disciplinary measures may be taken. The term “unauthorized aids” refers to aids that the teacher has not previously specified as permissible aids and that may assist in solving the examination task. This means that all aids not specified as permissible are prohibited. The Swedish version has interpretative precedence in the event of a conflict.

Remarks

Students must register for the courses themselves, or contact ETKS educational administration eduetks@ltu.se, not later than three days after the quarter commences. Failure to do so can result in the place being lost. This rule also applies to students with a guaranteed place.
