Entry requirements

Completed courses of at least 120 credits, with at least the grade Pass. This must include the following course: Business management and organisation (E0006N) 7,5 credits or Industrial management (E0009N) 7,5 credits, or equivalent knowledge. Good knowledge in English, equivalent to English 6.

Selection

The selection is based on 30-285 credits

Course Aim

The overall aim of the course is that students after completing the course will be able to analyse, evaluate, understand and create innovation in organisations.

After completing the course the student should be able to:

- Describe and discuss the key concepts in management of innovation, and how these concepts relate to each other
- Explain how these key concepts relate to the achievement of goals in the innovation environments, such as increased product innovation, efficient processes, or new services.
- Explain when various management and organisational strategies are applicable and how they must adapt to different types of external situations.
- Analysing the organisations practical challenges in generating and implementing innovation by applying key concepts in the course.
- Theorise and reflect on the problems, opportunities, system boundaries and the "ground rules" that enable or hinder innovation and progress toward goals in organisations.

Contents

The course has a strategic management and organizational perspective on innovation and innovative development; of what innovation is, how it occurs and how innovation can be stimulated, led and organized.

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

Teaching and learning is carried out through lectures, student led work-shops, self-studies, and seminars. Participation in seminars is compulsory. The course is mainly carried out in English.

Examination

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided. Written exam

Unauthorized aids during exams and assessments
