Contents

The course provides a basic overview of key problems in modern philosophy. Emphasis is placed on philosophical understanding and not on the historical and biographical context of ideas. The topics dealt with include the following: the problem of knowledge and skepticism, free will, the philosophy of time, and the philosophy of mind.
