## Entry requirements

In order to meet the general entry requirements for first cycle studies you must have successfully completed upper secondary education and documented skills in English language and for this course, philosophy of 60 credits, or equivalent, is also required. F0004S Critical Thinking and Logic, F0005S Ethics, F0006S Ethics II, F0008S Philosophy of Language, F0001A Phenomenology, hermeneutics and existentialism and F0002A Philosophy B, essay or equivalent, should be included in these credits.

The selection is based on 1-165 credits.

## Course Aim

After the course, the student should be able to independently discuss a limited philosophical topic and write a philosophical essay (for 15 credits).

## Contents

The essay is the final stage of the philosophical undergraduate education and the purpose is for the student to learn how to independently discuss a limited philosophical subject. After completing the course, the student should be able to independently formulate and discuss a philosophical problem in writing. This requires formulating a clear question and thesis, arguing well, using correct language and mastering formal details, such as proper notes and references.

## Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

Self-study, supervision and presentation at a seminar (including acting as opponent on another student's essay).

## Examination

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided. Writing an essay and presenting it at a seminar; acting as opponent on another student's essay.

To pass the course the student shall participate in compulsory meetings and seminars as well as register the thesis according to LTUs rules.

## Remarks

Students must register for the courses themselves, or contact ETS educational administration [eduets@ltu.se](mailto:eduets@ltu.se), not later than three days after the quarter commences. Failure to do so can result in the place being lost. This rule also applies to students with a guaranteed place.
