Course Aim

Knowledge and understanding

After completing the course students should be able to:

- Based on examples, give a general description of Rome, both as a living reference in architectural history and as a modern metropolitan environment.

Competence and skills

After completing the course students should be able to:

- Present in oral and written form an urban space or a building to potential colleagues, partners and / or clients.

Judgement and approach

After completing the course students should be able to:

- Describe their experience of the study trip as a tool for acquiring practical related knowledge and inspiration for their own tasks.

Contents

The course consists of a series of lectures on the history and significance of the study trip, as well as the history of architecture and urban planning, with special emphasis on the city of Rome. Parallel to the lectures, each course participant prepares an oral and a written presentation of an urban space, a building or an urban area through literature studies. The preparation of these presentation is guided by the teacher and the written presentations are put together by the students into a joint travel guide. During four course days in Barcelona / Paris / Rome, the course participants present the material they prepared, the content and verbal performance of which are discussed and commented by the teachers and the group jointly.

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

The teaching consists of lectures at LTU and teacher-led seminars at selected objects in Rome. The students produce a joint travel guidebook. The travel and all expenses are paid for by the participants themselves.

Examination

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided. To pass the course, attendance at all lectures, an approved written and oral presentation as well as an active participation throughout the study trip is required.
