Entry requirements

A passing grade on the entrance test for the Master Programme in Music Performance specialisation in instruments. The test must demonstrate knowledge, skills and working methods to be able to independently learn and perform music as an instrumentalist at a high level of artistic quality.

Course Aim

The Master's programme in music performance focuses on four interacting perspectives, all of which aim to put one's own music performance in a context:

- Interpretation
- Analysis
- Tradition/Innovation
- The public interaction

During the course, the student shall have

- acquired an independent approach in the interpretation of the selected repertoire
- acquired a basic stylistic awareness and artistic expressiveness
- acquired basic knowledge about performance practices and sense of style
- showed ability to develop his or her artistic voice and identity.

Contents

Individual and Group lessons, Seminars, Master classes, Ensemble.

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

In consultation with the student, an individual arrangement is done of the course's specialisation, repertoire, concerts/artistic productions, presentations and oral and/or written documentations.

Examination

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided. Every teaching session constitutes an examined presentation of assigned tasks. The examination of the course takes place in the final presentation.

The tasks presented are determined by the teacher and student together based on the individual planning.

For the grade of Pass (Godkänd), it is expected that the student has carried out and presented the assigned tasks, all in such a way that the intended course learning outcomes are fulfilled. For the grade of Pass with credit (Väl godkänd), it is expected that the student has fulfilled all requirements for the grade of Pass, and in addition, demonstrated a skill and originality in the musical performance that exceeds what is required for the grade of Pass.

Remarks

Students must register for the courses themselves, or contact ETKS educational administration eduetks@ltu.se, not later than three days after the quarter commences. Failure to do so can result in the place being lost. This rule also applies to students with a guaranteed place.

Literature. Valid from Autumn 2019 Sp 1

Study resources and course literature are specified by the instructing teacher and are comprised of literature/music adapted to the student's instrument including any ensemble repertoires.
