Selection

The selection is based on final school grades or Swedish Scholastic Aptitude Test.

Course Aim

The course aims to give course participants an increased understanding of how academic knowledge can be used in practical gender equality efforts in organizations and society.

The aims of the course are for the course participant to be able to:

- Describe how academic knowledge has previously been used for practical gender equality efforts.
- Reflect on own experiences and interests of practical gender equality efforts, in the light of academic knowledge.
- Assess how academic knowledge can be used to plan, implement and analyze practical gender equality efforts.

Contents

The course is about how academic knowledge can be used in practical gender equality efforts in organizations and society.

The content of the course covers three themes:

- Theme 1: Working for equal conditions with academic knowledge of laws, methods, structures and processes for practical gender equality efforts.
- Theme 2: Digital support tools with academic knowledge of digital tools as support in practical gender equality efforts.
- Theme 3: Norm-critical perspectives with academic knowledge of norms regarding gender, ethnicity, disability, etc. in practical gender equality efforts.

The course is aimed especially at participants who themselves manage or participate in gender equality efforts and is designed as a location- and time-independent distance course, with a reduced study pace, in order to be combined with other employment. In order to make use of the course participants' own experiences and engagement, the course is based on the pedagogy of peer-to-peer learning, where the participants support each other's knowledge development.

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

The course is conducted remotely via the university's learning platform. The course is divided into three themes which are covered in chronological order during the course. Within each theme, course participants must complete the following compulsory study tasks:

Examination

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided.

The learning objectives are examined through the mandatory study tasks listed below. Grading takes place according to a G/U grading scale. All examination elements must be completed for the final grade on the course. Reexamination can take place a maximum of five times per study assignment. If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the guidelines for student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, there is a possibility of adapted or alternative forms of examination.

Unauthorized aids during exams and assessments

If a student, by using unauthorized aids, tries to mislead during an exam or when a study performance is to be assessed, disciplinary measures may be taken.
