## **Entry requirements**

In order to meet the general entry requirements for first cycle studies you must have successfully completed upper secondary education and documented skills in English language + Passed admission test. In the admission test, the applicant's prior knowledge in musicality, technology, artistic design, creative processes and music theory is assessed. The admission test consists of tests in music theory, playing tests, conducting tests and singing tests.

#### **Selection**

The selection is based on final school grades or Swedish Scholastic Aptitude Test.

#### **Course Aim**

- 1. Knowledge and understanding
- Upon completion of the course, the student shall
- demonstrate basic knowledge and understanding of music theory as a fundamental part of the craft of music
- demonstrate basic knowledge and understanding of singing and aural skills as important parts of the craft of music
- 2. Competence and skill

Upon completion of the course, the student shall

- · demonstrate basic knowledge and skills in the use of the voice in singing and speaking
- demonstrate basic competence in music theory
- demonstrate basic competence in aural skills
- 3. Judgement and approach

Upon completion of the course, the student shall

- be able to reflect on the development of their own musical craft
- demonstrate a reflective approach to their own learning

The course includes

- · training in aural skills (ear training)
- · music theory
- vocals/voice training

## **Examination**

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided. Examination is by means of written and notation-based assignments (aural skills and music theory) and by means of practical demonstration (aural skills/vocals and voice training) and notation-based examination (aural skills).

## Unauthorized aids during exams and assessments

If a student, by using unauthorized aids, tries to mislead during an exam or when a study performance is to be assessed, disciplinary measures may be taken. The term "unauthorized aids" refers to aids that the teacher has not previously specified as permissible aids and that may assist in solving the examination task. This means that all aids not specified as permissible are prohibited. The Swedish version has interpretative precedence in the event of a conflict.

#### **Remarks**

Students must register for the courses themselves, or contact ETKS educational administration eduetks@ltu.se, not later than three days after the quarter commences. Failure to do so can result in the place being lost. This rule also applies to students with a guaranteed place.
