Entry requirements

In order to meet the general entry requirements for first cycle studies you must have successfully completed upper secondary education and documented skills in English language + Passed admission test. In the admission test, the applicant's prior knowledge in musicality, technology, artistic design, creative processes and music theory is assessed. The admission test consists of tests in music theory, playing tests, conducting tests and singing tests.

Selection

The selection is based on final school grades or Swedish Scholastic Aptitude Test.

Course Aim

- 1. Knowledge and understanding
- Upon completion of the course, the student shall
- demonstrate basic knowledge and understanding of musical, technical and methodological aspects of their own musical practice
- demonstrate basic knowledge and understanding of service playing and keyboard harmony in the church music profession
- demonstrate basic knowledge and understanding of solo organ playing in the church music profession
- demonstrate basic knowledge and understanding of conducting in the church music profession

2. Competence and skill

Upon completion of the course, the student shall

- be able to demonstrate basic skills in rehearsing assigned repertoire
- be able to demonstrate basic ability to perform assignments on the organ, both technically and artistically
- be able to demonstrate basic ability to perform conducting assignments conducting, both artistically and in terms of gesture and technique

3. Judgement and approach

Upon completion of the course, the student shall

- be able to reflect on their own development of instrumental skills and conducting skills
- be able to reflect on their own learning

- · Solo organ playing
- Service playing
- · Ensemble conducting

Examination

Unauthorized aids during exams and assessments

The term "unauthorized aids" refers to aids that the teacher has not previously specified as permissible aids and that may assist in solving the examination task. This means that all aids not specified as permissible are prohibited. The Swedish version has interpretative precedence in the event of a conflict.
