Course Aim

After completion of the course, students should be able to give examples of different ways of applying different periodizations in history and being able to orient themselves in different epochs in Sweden and the Nordic region. They should be able to show how the notions of time and different periodizations are used in history as a tool to interpret the past. Students will develop the understanding that each time people must be judged based on the historical context they found. They should also be able to identify the difference between history as an academic discipline and history as a school subject. In addition, the students will become acquainted with theories of learning and the results of subject didactic research in order to develop teaching and have the basic ability to assess students' knowledge in relation to the school's governing documents and course plan.

Contents

The course addresses the role of periodization and presents different perspectives that can form the basis of epoch divisions. In this context, some possible epoch divisions in European society are compared with epoch divisions in other societies. In the course, the way in which the term is used to interpret the past is problematized. The course also deals with history as an academic discipline versus history as a subject in school, as well as theories of learning and knowledge assessment relevant to teaching history in school.

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

The course is conducted in the form of lectures and seminars focusing on historical methodology, periodization and history didactics. The experience of the course is to be reported continuously at seminars in interaction with other students.

Examination

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided.
Active participation in seminars, 3.5 credits (U, G).
Written Exam, 4.0 credits (U, G, VG).

Remarks
