Entry requirements

Course Aim

After completion of the course, students should be able to account for different forms of historical change (social, technological and economic) and how different explanatory models interpret these changes. In addition, they must be able to identify and explain several different societal changes based on the different explanatory models. Students should also be able to use a variety of relevant learning tools.

Contents

The course deals with different explanatory models for historical change based on social, technical and economic factors and their interrelationships. Examples are taken from all epochs, but the focus is on Middle age and Early modern periods. Learning tools relevant.

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.
Lectures and seminars.

Examination

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided.

Active participation in seminars, 2 credits (U, G).

Oral and written presentation, 2 credits (U, G).

In-depth study in group (oral and written presentation), 3,5 credits (U, G, VG)

Written exam, 7.5 credits (U, G, VG)

To pass the course, G is required on all subjects. For the grade Pass with distinction, VG is required for the exam and G at the other subjects.
