Entry requirements

In order to meet the general entry requirements for first cycle studies you must have successfully completed upper secondary education and documented skills in English language and completed the courses Nation, Ethnicity and Identity (H0030N) 7,5 credits, Time creates the world (H0031N) 7,5 credits and Societal change from different perspectives (H0037N) 15 credits with at least a passing grade, or equivalent courses in history 30 credits.

Selection

The selection is based on 1-165 credits.

Course Aim

After completion of the course, students will be able to explain how groups in interpreted their history in the light of post-colonial development. They should be able to relate this process to postcolonial theories about the view of the other and gender theories about gender power distribution in society. They should be able to describe how women and other groups sought emancipation during the 20th century.

Contents

In this course, history is studied as a means of group identification and gender as a power distribution system. The course is about political mobilization and emancipation processes of different groups. In this context, theories dealing with gender and ethnicity and the distribution of power within different societies are discussed.

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

Lectures and seminars based on the course literature. The students carry out specific thematic tasks regarding the changing roles of specific groups in the history writing. The post-colonial emancipatory perspective is problematized as well as theories around gender, ethnicity.

Examination

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided. Individual written assignment and active participation in a seminar, 3 credits (U, G, VG). Written exam, 4.5 credits (U, G, VG).

VG in the first and second stages is required for VG on the course.

All subjects require G for an approved course.



Unauthorized aids during exams and assessments

If a student, by using unauthorized aids, tries to mislead during an exam or when a study performance is to be assessed, disciplinary measures may be taken. The term "unauthorized aids" refers to aids that the teacher has not previously specified as permissible aids and that may assist in solving the examination task. This means that all aids not specified as permissible are prohibited. The Swedish version has interpretative precedence in the event of a conflict.
