Entry requirements

In order to meet the general entry requirements for first cycle studies you must have successfully completed upper secondary education and documented skills in English language and completed the following courses with at least a passing grade; Nation, Ethnicity and Identity (H0030N) 7,5 credits, Time creates the world (H0031N) 7,5 credits, Societal change from different perspectives (H0037N) 15 credits, Societal Groups and changing power relations (H0039N) 7,5 credits, Source criticism and historical narrative (H0040N) 7,5 credits, An expanding world (H0041N) 7,5 credits and Roads to democracy (H0042N) 7,5 credits, or equivalent courses in history 60 credits.

Selection

The selection is based on 1-165 credits.

Course Aim

After completion of the course, students should be able to discuss and problematize the interrelationship between human, society and the environment with technology through history. In addition, they should be able to identify and describe a number of examples of the interrelationship in different historical times. Students should also be able to use relevant learning tools, such as IKT pedagogy.

Contents

The course focus on and problematize the interrelationship between human, society and the environment with technology through history, with focus on the 19th and 20th centuries. Thus, both the social drive behind technological development and the social impact of the technology, and environmental consequences are identified, as well as learning tools relevant to the field of knowledge.

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

Lessons, lectures, seminars and individual in-depth assignments. Through individual in-depth assignments and seminars, the student get the chance to work with different learning tools relevant to the field of knowledge, such as IKT pedagogy.

Examination

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided. Individual in-depth assignments, 5,5 credits (U, G, VG). Active participation in seminars, 2 credits (U, G).



Unauthorized aids during exams and assessments

If a student, by using unauthorized aids, tries to mislead during an exam or when a study performance is to be assessed, disciplinary measures may be taken. The term "unauthorized aids" refers to aids that the teacher has not previously specified as permissible aids and that may assist in solving the examination task. This means that all aids not specified as permissible are prohibited. The Swedish version has interpretative precedence in the event of a conflict.
