Main field of study

Jurisprudence

Entry requirements

In order to meet the general entry requirements for first cycle studies you must have successfully completed upper secondary education and documented skills in English language and at least 60 credits completed courses with at least a passing grade in jurisprudence/law, or equivalent.

Selection

The selection is based on 1-165 credits.

Course Aim

The aim of the course is to provide in depth insights in legal theory and legal methodology, specifically relevant for the Swedish legal culture. The aim is also to train the student's ability to critical examine and evaluate facts as well as train the student's skills in oral and written legal analysis and argumentation.

Contents

Legal theory and techniques and encompassing study of general jurisprudence, methods for interpreting court cases and laws as well as a study of legal history and legal philosophy. The course encompass discussions on central legal concepts such as justice, rule of law, equality, etc. and the understanding that such concepts may be understood differently based on historical, philosophical and gender-based perspectives.

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

Instruction consists of lectures, assignments and seminars.

Examination

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided. Written exam, essays and seminars.

Unauthorized aids during exams and assessments

If a student, by using unauthorized aids, tries to mislead during an exam or when a study performance is to be assessed, disciplinary measures may be taken. The term "unauthorized aids" refers to aids that the teacher has not previously specified as permissible aids and that may assist in solving the examination task. This means that all aids not specified as permissible are prohibited. The Swedish version has interpretative precedence in the event of a conflict.

Remarks

Students must register for the courses themselves or contact ETKS educational administration, eduetks@ltu.se not later than three days after the quarter commences. Failure to do so can result in the place being lost. This rule also applies to students with a guaranteed place.
