Entry requirements

Completed courses of at least 120 credits, with at least the grade Pass. This must include the following courses: Industrial Management with a Sustainability Perspective (G0010N) 7,5 credits, Industrial management control and finance (R0028N) 7,5 credits, Industrial marketing (M0037N) 7,5 credits, Industrial management (E0009N) 7,5 credits, Industrial logistics (K0020N) 7,5 credits and Operations management and strategy (K0019N) 7,5 credits, or equivalent knowledge.

Selection

The selection is based on 30-285 credits

Course Aim

The goal of the course is that the student shall develop the ability to apply research methods on business problems.

After the course the student shall be able to:

- explain and use central concepts in the area of research methods used in business and management research
- develop a written research proposal in the area of business and management research utilizing a logical and appropriate development of theoretical and research method issues
- give an oral presentation of the research proposal and be able to defend its content
- analyze and oppose on a written research proposal in the area of business and management research.

Contents

Lectures will consider basic concepts in theory of science, research methods as well as the research process including planning, design, data collection and reporting of a research project. The students will apply research method on a selected problem and present and defend their research proposal at seminars as well as critically review and discuss research proposals developed by other teams.

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

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Examination

Unauthorized aids during exams and assessments
