Course Aim

After finishing the course, the student will have acquired knowledge regarding current comprehensive subject matters regarding lifestyle questions. The point of departure is lifestyle and the connection between lifestyle and health. The course provides in-depth learning about lifestyle, health and technical matters and also treats basic health-economic knowledge.

Contents

The course starts with a description of the Swedish welfare system, its purpose, organisation and how it is financed as well as an introduction to the connection between economic factors and health. Following this, basic healtheconomic theories and methods which can be used to evaluate costs, risks and use in connection with healthpromoting actions of a technical, medical or social character, from a social economic perspective. During the course, the connection between the lifestyle of the individual and health will be analysed from the perspective of the individual. The connection between the social and economic conditions and the health of the individual are studied. In addition, the course deals with whether individuals actually are able to choose their lifestyle. Also analysed here are, for example, how different changes in the welfare system could influence both the health conditions of the individuals and their possibilities to influence their lifestyle. Besides, students are expected to market their skills and competencies to possible future employers.

Seminars and Take-home examination. Students who have failed an examination on five occasions will not be allowed further resits.
