Main field of study

Natural Resource Governance

Entry requirements

Academic degree, minimum 180 credits of which at least 90 credits in social-, technical- or natural science subjects and completed the following courses with at least a passing grade; Introduction to natural resource governance (N7013N) 7,5 credits and Actors and natural resources (N7014N) 7,5 credits, or equivalent. Good knowledge in English, equivalent to English 6.

Selection

The selection is based on 30-285 credits

Course Aim

After completing the course participants should be able to:

Knowledge and understanding:

- Describe and explain relevant institutions, policies and economic aspects related to natural resource governance
- Describe and explain the economy-environment interaction from an institutional perspective

Competence and skills:

- Analyse institutions, policies and economic aspects related to the issue of natural resource governance
- Work in groups to analyse and evaluate different institutional aspects related to natural resource governance
- Present, motivate and discuss written and orally various problems related to natural resource governance institutions, policies and economics

Judgement and approach:

- Evaluate and critically reflect on different institutional perspectives and their underlying assumptions and understandings of natural resource governance
- Evaluate and critically reflect on approaches and arguments presented in scientific articles in the field

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

This course utilizes a problem- and case-based approach. The course realization is through lectures, literature studies, individual and group assignments.

Examination

Unauthorized aids during exams and assessments
