Entry requirements

The selection is based on final school grades or Swedish Scholastic Aptitude Test.

Course Aim

After successfully completing the course, the student is expected to be able to:

- describe and reflect on the experience of living with mental illness
- explain and discuss the importance of the family relationships for recovery with serious mental health problems
- identify the needs of the individual and resources of persons with mental illness
- give suggestions and discuss and present reasons for measures and approaches that can promote recovery
- relate relationships, needs and actions with the aim of promoting recovery in the care of individuals with mental illness

Realization
