Entry requirements

In order to meet the general entry requirements for first cycle studies you must have successfully completed upper secondary education and documented skills in English language and .

Selection

The selection is based on 1-165 credits.

Course Aim

After successfully completing the course, the student is expected to be able to:

- identify, contrast and critique their own values and attitudes in relation to mental ill-health and psychiatric care
- describe and reflect on factors that facilitate and hamper a recovery-oriented approach to psychiatric care
- describe the importance of reflection and identify prerequisites for learning in care work
- describe methods and principles for sustainable change work in psychiatric care
- identify barriers and opportunities for recovery-focused change in psychiatric care with a focus on the structure, culture and content of the care work

- Ethics with a focus on moral responsibility

Realization

Unauthorized aids during exams and assessments
