Main field of study

Psychology

Entry requirements

In order to meet the general entry requirements for first cycle studies you must have successfully completed upper secondary education and documented skills in English language + Swedish upper secondary school courses Mathematics 2a or 2b or 2c, Social Studies 1b or 1a1+1a2.

Selection

The selection is based on final school grades or Swedish Scholastic Aptitude Test.

Course Aim

Knowledge and comprehension

After passing the course, the student should be able to show knowledge and comprehension:

- For psychological concepts and theories from a psychological perspective
- For how social psychological concepts and theories can be applied and its consequences

Skills and abilities

After passing the course, the student should be able to show basic ability to:

- Search for and collect relevant information related to a social psychological issue
- Plan and carry out an experimental social psychological study within given time frames
- Present a social psychological study in writing and critically discuss its results

Appraisal and approach

After passing the course, the student should be able to show basic ability to:

- Make assessments of peers' work based on scientific aspects
- Reflect on their need to develop competence in scientific methodology and writing

Contents

This course focuses on theories and methods for the understanding of the human as a social being with emphasis on cognitions, intentions, behavior and mood.

The following areas will be covered:

- Social cognition and social perception
- The self
- Attitudes and liking
- Stereotypes, prejudice and discrimination
- Social influence
- Aggression and pro-social behavior
- Groups and individuals
- Information technology

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

The teaching within this course typically includes self-study, lectures, lessons with discussions and exercises, project work with data collection, peer assessment, as well as written presentation and reflection.

In order to achieve the course's goals regarding *knowledge and comprehension*, the student should independently study the specified course literature and other literature/material provided during the course, as well as take part in lectures/lessons and recommended exercises.

In order to achieve the course's goals regarding *skills and abilities*, the student must actively participate in a lesson on information technology and the course's project work, as well as in written presentation. The project work trains the ability to search for and gather information, plan and carry out an experimental study, as well as the ability to critically discuss the results of the study. The project work, including written presentation, is carried out through collaboration in groups.

In order to achieve the course's goals regarding *appraisal and approach*, the student must individually carry out a peer assessment of another group's project report and a written reflection.

Teaching resources are provided and some communication and submissions are handled via the internet-based course platform Canvas. This means specific requirements for technical equipment and competence.

Parts of the course may be given in English .

Examination

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided. The course is examined through written exam (5.0 credits, grades: U G VG) and report, (2.5 credits, grades: U G). In the examination form report, following elements are examined: participation in a lesson in information technology, completion of a social psychological study, written presentation, peer assessment and written reflection.

Knowledge and comprehension are examined through the examination form exam. The exam is written and individual.

Skills and abilities are examined through the completion of a social psychological study and a written report. The social psychological study and written report are examined in groups. Participation in a lesson in information technology is mandatory. In the event of impediment, the mandatory attendance can be replaced by an equivalent compensation assignment.

Appraisal and approach are examined through peer assessment and written reflection. Peer assessment and written reflection are examined individually.

All examinations forms must be completed for the final grade in the course.

Unauthorized aids during exams and assessments

If a student, by using unauthorized aids, tries to mislead during an exam or when a study performance is to be assessed, disciplinary measures may be taken. The term "unauthorized aids" refers to aids that the teacher has not previously specified as permissible aids and that may assist in solving the examination task. This means that all aids not specified as permissible are prohibited. The Swedish version has interpretative precedence in the event of a conflict.

Remarks

Students must register for the courses themselves, or contact HLT:s educational administration eduhlt@ltu.se, not later than three days after the quarter commences. Failure to do so can result in the place being lost. This rule also applies to students with a guaranteed place.
