Course Aim

Completing the course, the student should be able to: - Describe and discuss the historical, geographical, religious and political conditions in the Middle East including North Africa. - Describe and explain the major issues and conflicts which characterizes the region today and its historical development, and - Analyze and discuss conditions for peace and stability in the region, and also prerequisites for democratical/economical/societal development.

Contents

The course deals with a number of crucial issues and concepts such as: - The concept Middle East. The area's history and also the religious and cultural development with emphasis on the past few centuries. - The political development in the region since WWII. - Attempts to make peace in the region.
