Entry requirements

In order to meet the general entry requirements for first cycle studies you must have successfully completed upper secondary education and documented skills in English language + Swedish upper secondary school course English 6.

Selection

The selection is based on final school grades or Swedish Scholastic Aptitude Test.

Course Aim

After completing the course, the student shall be able to explain how work groups are formed, developed, and led. The student shall also be able to identify and discuss the importance of different group processes for workgroup's performance and efficiency. The student shall also be able to explain several key problems that work groups struggle with, such as the individual's role in groups, relationships within and between groups, how conflicts in groups can arise and be resolved and how this affects groups' productivity. The student must also be able to independently identify relevant sociological and group psychological theories, and apply these when analyzing a current problem within the field.

Contents

The course deals with interactions within and between different types of groups. The focus is on group dynamics and group processes and how these affect groups in working life. The course covers various basic sociological and social psychological theories that concern, for example, roles, relationships, norms, conformity, exclusion mechanisms, influence and conflict patterns.

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

The course is realized through lectures and seminars. The course is given in English.

Examination

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided.

The course is examined via a written assignment, 5 credits, and seminars, 2.5 credits.



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Unauthorized aids during exams and assessments

If a student, by using unauthorized aids, tries to mislead during an exam or when a study performance is to be assessed, disciplinary measures may be taken. The term "unauthorized aids" refers to aids that the teacher has not previously specified as permissible aids and that may assist in solving the examination task. This means that all aids not specified as permissible are prohibited. The Swedish version has interpretative precedence in the event of a conflict.
