Entry requirements

In order to meet the general entry requirements for first cycle studies you must have successfully completed upper secondary education and documented skills in English language + Swedish upper secondary school course English 6.

Selection

The selection is based on final school grades or Swedish Scholastic Aptitude Test.

Course Aim

The student is after the course able to explain central sociological perspectives, concepts and theories within the field of organizational studies, and be able to analyze situations, problems and issues within organizations using these perspectives, theories and concepts as tools. Moreover, the student is able to explain some fundamental organizational problems, analyze the forces behind these problems, and give examples of how they can be handled. The student is also able to analyze research and information within the leadership area from different sociological perspectives, individually describe and analyze applied leadership, and point out advantages and disadvantages associated with different organization and leadership principles.

Contents

Focus in the course is on leadership and on the role of the leader in different organizations. The course is also pointing out different strategic choices related to organizing, their intended and unintended consequences. The social interaction between management and employees, between and within organizations, both vertically and horizontally is treated. The development of modern organizations, human resource management and organization development and change is analyzed through cases. Within all the mentioned fields the students are supposed to find and present examples that can be discussed in class.

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

The course is realized through lectures, seminars and group assignments. The students are supposed to attend some of the seminars. Before every seminar the students are supposed to work with compulsory assignments, present them and discuss them in class. The students work in groups with these assignments. The course will be taught in English.

Examination

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided. The course will be examined continuously by preparation of group assignments and an individually written report. Written report 4,5 hp, mandatory seminars 3 hp.

Unauthorized aids during exams and assessments

If a student, by using unauthorized aids, tries to mislead during an exam or when a study performance is to be assessed, disciplinary measures may be taken. The term “unauthorized aids” refers to aids that the teacher has not previously specified as permissible aids and that may assist in solving the examination task. This means that all aids not specified as permissible are prohibited. The Swedish version has interpretative precedence in the event of a conflict.

Remarks

Students must register for the courses themselves, or contact ETKS educational administration eduetks@ltu.se, not later than three days after the quarter commences. Failure to do so can result in the place being lost. This rule also applies to students with a guaranteed place.
