## **Entry requirements**

In order to meet the general entry requirements for first cycle studies you must have successfully completed upper secondary education and documented skills in English language +

Swedish upper secondary school courses Mathematics 1a or 1b or 1c, Social Studies 1b or 1a1+1a2.

## **Selection**

The selection is based on final school grades or Swedish Scholastic Aptitude Test.

## **Course Aim**

The goal is that the student should after the course show that they both orally and in writing, individually and in groups, to describe and analyze;

- · Relevant theories of organization and work,
- · Work conditions in society and men's and women's relationship to work
- · Organizational theory from a gender perspective

## **Contents**

The course aims to provide conceptual knowledge of why organizations exist and how organizations function, as well as to highlight and treat the history and development of organizational sociology. During the course, through seminars and written assignment, the students will be trained to describe and analyze various organizational theories in an empirical context. Different forms of organization from bureaucracy to project organizations and their importance for various activities in society will be highlighted. During the course, the work conditions in modern society and in organizations will also be described and discussed from a number of different points of view, with a particular focus on women's and men's relationships to work and organization from a gender perspective.

## Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

Lessons, seminars and group exercises. Attendance is compulsory unless the schema state otherwise.

## **Examination**

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If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided.

Oral and written examination via seminar and written exam.



# Unauthorized aids during exams and assessments
