Entry requirements

In order to meet the general entry requirements for first cycle studies you must have successfully completed upper secondary education and documented skills in English language and completed the following courses with at least a passing grade; Basic Theory in Sociology (S0015A) 7,5 credits, Organisation and work sociology (S0016A) 7,5 credits, Basic Socialpsychology (S0052A) 7,5 credits, Essay writing in sociology (S0060A) 7,5 credits, Theory of science in Sociology (S0046A) 7,5 credits and Methods in sociology I (S0047A) 15 credits, or equivalent.

Selection

The selection is based on 1-165 credits.

Course Aim

At the end of the course, students should be able to:

- · identify different variants of social psychological theory
- account for identity creation problems in modern society
- describe ritualized forms of social interaction
- · explain various theories of groups, group processes and leadership
- identify key differences between interactionistic and actor-oriented social psychology.

Contents

The course covers an overview of various social psychological approaches. A more profound investigation is done of modernity specific psychological problems and conditions. The understanding of the importance of social rituals in social interaction, personal development and well-being. Aspects of social psychological problems of a group is investigated with the help of the concepts of, belonging, cohesion, internal and external relations, and leadership.

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

Implementation of the course is done with introductory lectures on assigned literature and follow-up seminars. Active participation in seminars is mandatory. The course ends with an individual's work which is recorded in a written report.



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Examination

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided.

The individual written report corresponds to 4.0 credits. Participation in the seminar include 3.5 credits.

When applicable, if the written examination does not reach PASS at the first examination, a new opportunity to submit a revised version will be possible during two occasions the current year. In case the examination assignment still does not reach PASS, the student is assigned a new examination assignment the next time the course is given.

Unauthorized aids during exams and assessments

If a student, by using unauthorized aids, tries to mislead during an exam or when a study performance is to be assessed, disciplinary measures may be taken. The term "unauthorized aids" refers to aids that the teacher has not previously specified as permissible aids and that may assist in solving the examination task. This means that all aids not specified as permissible are prohibited. The Swedish version has interpretative precedence in the event of a conflict.

Remarks

Students must register for the courses themselves, or contact ETKS educational administration eduetks@ltu.se, not later than three days after the quarter commences. Failure to do so can result in the place being lost. This rule also applies to students with a guaranteed place.
