Entry requirements

In order to meet the general entry requirements for first cycle studies you must have successfully completed upper secondary education and documented skills in English language and completed at least 60 credits in the subject Sociology, and completed the following courses with at least a passing grade; Methods in sociology I (S0047A) 15 credits and Applied sociological analysis and methods (S0059A) 15 credits, or equivalent.

Selection

The selection is based on 1-165 credits.

Course Aim

The student should after the course be able to:

- Initiate, carry out and report a literature based review plan a research project
- Plan an empirically based research project
- Identify and assess one's own research focus in relation to the field
- apply quantitative research methods, including methods for data processing and analysis
- examine, reflect and critically evaluate ones' own data collection, analysis and conclusions

Contents

The course covers preparatory elements in scientific work, such as planning a scientific study and present and discuss a research plan. Moreover, application of quantitative analysis methods are covered.

A literature review and ethics in research is focused in the qualitative part of the course. Quantitative, statistical analysis of data from databases or own collected data material forms the base for the quantitative part of the course. Correlation studies, multiple linear regression and logistic regression is discussed and applied in the quantitative part.

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

The course is conducted with continuous lectures and seminars. The seminars are focused on practical exercises or accounting of assigned responsibilities. A literature review and a research plan in the qualitative methods part. Quantitative methods: Lectures and exercises (computer labs) in statistical methods with the help of statistical software (SPSS) and with data from existing databases or own collected material.

Examination

In case the essay still does not reach PASS, one more possibility for submitting a revised version will be scheduled. If the essay does still not reach PASS, the next possibility for submitting is the next time the course is given.
