Course Aim

At the end of the course students should be able to:

- describe the meaning of a range of social psychology's basic theories and concepts
- identify theories and concepts in relation to the areas of social interaction, social cognition and the sociology of emotions.
- explain the differences between sociological social psychology and psychological social psychology
- present selected examples of social psychological analysis
- describe how a number of social psychology perspectives is applied in social psychology analysis.

Contents

The field of social psychology, it's origin and evolution. The division between a sociological social psychology and a psychological social psychology. Particular emphasis on theories of social interaction, social cognition and sociology of emotions constitute the core of the course. Introduction of the dramaturgical perspective of social action and it's application in a classic social psychological study of social interaction.

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

The course is conducted with lectures and literature seminars. Some of the seminars includes group presentations of assigned literature. Active participation in the seminars is mandatory. The course concludes with a written examination.

Examination

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided.

Active participation in three seminars and participation in oral presentations of assigned literature corresponds to 3.0 credits. The written examination contains a selection of theories and concepts from assigned literature and corresponds to 4,5 credits.

When applicable, if the written examination (essay) does not reach PASS at the first examination, a new opportunity to submit a revised version will be possible, time-wise close to the first examination. In case the essay still does not reach PASS, one more possibility for submitting a revised version will be scheduled. If the essay does still not reach PASS, the next possibility for submitting is the next time the course is given.

Remarks

Students must register for the courses themselves or contact ETKS educational administration, eduetks@ltu.se, not later than three days after the quarter commences. Failure to do so can result in the place being lost. This rule also applies to students with a guaranteed place.
