Entry requirements

In order to meet the general entry requirements for first cycle studies you must have successfully completed upper secondary education and documented skills in English language

Selection

The selection is based on final school grades or Swedish Scholastic Aptitude Test.

Course Aim

After completing the course, the student should be able to:

- · explain, exemplify and apply basic scientific data collection and analysis methods
- give an account of the social science research process
- independently formulate a research problem and reflect on and assess what are reasonable theory and method choices
- apply different methodological tools for data analysis
- critically examine social science reports or previous research based on how these have handled the connection between social science theory and qualitative and quantitative approaches to study scientific problems
- at a basic level report, present and make scientific results available

Contents

The course deals with the different stages of the social science research process, qualitative and quantitative methods, different data collection methods such as questionnaires, register data, interview, and observation. The course also deals with methods for analysing qualitative data (interview, observation) and quantitative data (survey, register data).

Realization

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Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

Teaching is given in the form of lectures and seminars/group exercises/computer labs. Attendance is mandatory for seminars and group exercises as well as computer labs. The perspectives highlighted in the sub-lectures are followed up in seminars where the students, both individually and in groups, learn the methods by applying them themselves and discussing its possibilities and limitations. A significant part of the course consists of applying independently and in groups in connection with laboratories the methods covered by performing qualitative analyses (coding and concept generation) and quantitative analyses (statistical analyses, e.g. cross table, chi2, correlation) with the help of statistical programs. The students are offered the opportunity work with research themes that relate to the sociological research conducted at the department of industrial science.

Examination

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided.

Examination through participation in seminars, computer labs and a written report outlining the methodological knowledge applied. Through seminars examined the goals that the student after completing the course will be able to:

- critically examine social science reports or previous research based on how they have dealt with social science theory and qualitative and quantitative approaches to the study of scientific problems
- · explain, give examples and apply basic scientific work and analysis to
- · describe for the social science research

Through the written report examined the goals that the student after completing the course will be able to:

- independently formulate a research problem which is then analyzed with appropriate methodological tools
- · explain, give examples and apply basic scientific work and analysis
- · stringent reporting of scientific results

Unauthorized aids during exams and assessments
