Main field of study

Entry requirements

In order to meet the general entry requirements for first cycle studies you must have successfully completed upper secondary education and documented skills in English language

Selection

The selection is based on final school grades or Swedish Scholastic Aptitude Test.

Course Aim

After passing the course, the student should:

- be able to account for basic features of sociological theories about class, gender and ethnicity.
- demonstrate the ability to reflect on the impact of structures and processes on people's and groups' conditions and living conditions.
- be able to apply theories of class, gender and ethnicity to understand and analyse social phenomena

Contents

The course introduces social stratification and inequality-creating structures and processes in modern society. Central categories (class, gender, and ethnicity) are highlighted theoretically and empirically, separately and in relation to each other. The student is given tools to describe and analyze patterns of stratification and people's and groups' varying living conditions.

Realization

Each course occasion's language and form is stated and appear on the course page on Luleå University of Technology's website.

The teaching consists of lectures, seminars, and group exercises, as well as a final written assignment. Class, gender and ethnicity are empirically and theoretically highlighted, separately and in relation to each other. The student is trained to describe, discuss, and analyze stratification based on current phenomena orally and in writing, individually and in groups.

Examination

If there is a decision on special educational support, in accordance with the Guideline Student's rights and obligations at Luleå University of Technology, an adapted or alternative form of examination can be provided.

The course is examined through active participation in a seminar and an individual written take-home exam.

Unauthorized aids during exams and assessments

If a student, by using unauthorized aids, tries to mislead during an exam or when a study performance is to be assessed, disciplinary measures may be taken. The term “unauthorized aids” refers to aids that the teacher has not previously specified as permissible aids and that may assist in solving the examination task. This means that all aids not specified as permissible are prohibited. The Swedish version has interpretative precedence in the event of a conflict.

Remarks

Students must register for the courses themselves, or contact ETKS educational administration eduetks@ltu.se, no later than three days after the quarter commences. Failure to do so can result in the place being lost. This rule also applies to students with a guaranteed place.
