Course Aim

At the end of the course the student should have knowledge about

- Knowledge about different established perspectives about social and cultural change, nationally and internationally.
- Identify connections between social, cultural and economical changes at macro level and consequenses at individual level.
- Be able to do different analysis where theoretical concepts are used at different societal levels, for instance local municipalities social, cultural economical conditions in a global context.
- Be able to understand and analyse different events in relation to global communication in a changing risk society.

Contents

The course treats theories about how social change such as globilazation have consequences for human beings in social, cultural and economic concern in a regional and local context. Special focus on peoples experience of risk (for example environment, labormarket, economy, relations, culture) and trust on different social institutions (for example authorities, enterprises, intrest organisations) and how this can affect the self and the understandning of the world around.
