Course Aim

- Connections between different social and cultural categories such as class, gender, generation and ethnicity related to social processes that integrate or marginalize human beings in society.
- Be able to do different kind of analysis where theoretical concepts are applied on different social contexts
 where different integrations and marginalizing processes occure, for example labormarket/working life, living,
 health, political representation and environment.

Contents

The course treats theories and social, cultural and economical processes of which consequenses leads to integration or marginalization within identity creation in society. Of specific importance is the meaning of social class, gender, ethnicity and generation in this context. Themes are applied to global as well as regional and local societys.
