Course Aim

- · Show critical awareness of structural barriers and opportunities in working life
- Be able to analyse and critically value own and others work, from a sociological perspective
- Be able to present one's own work orally as well as in written form in an engaging and structured way, to the point, including reaching analytical height

Contents

The course is included in HRM master program and deals with sociological theories about opportunities and barriers in a changing working life where the objective is to give deepened knowledge about working life. Changes in society shows a trend to a more new liberal society. These changes affect agencies in welfare states and over time these changes might lead to social consequences and diversity in working life.

The course gives besides theoretical knowledge about changes in working life, knowledge about the future work.

Realization

Teaching and learning is mainly achieved via lectures and seminars.
